



Willingness to Recommend


Average Willingness to recommend | Q2 • 2016

Nursing Care


Average Nursing Care Score | Q2 • 2016

Overall Satisfaction


Average Satisfaction Score | Q2 • 2016

Patient Success Story – Mathew

At the young age of 23, Matthew Lemke was diagnosed with a malformation that was pressing on his cerebellum and brainstem, requiring that he immediately undergo surgery. Following surgery, Matthew was unable to move and was diagnosed with quadriplegia.

Following an extended stay in the intensive care unit, Matthew was admitted to PAM Rehabilitation Hospital of Victoria for physical and occupational therapy and continued medical management. When he arrived, he was in a wheelchair; lacked fine motor skills, balance, and coordination; and was extremely weak, requiring maximum assistance to sit up in bed. By the time Matthew was discharged home, he had made exceptional gains in his functional mobility, was able to perform activities of daily living independently, and was able to walk out of the facility without the use of an assistive device

Matthew worked very hard in therapy and says, "Although sometimes I didn't know if I could do it or not, the entire staff was always there with positive reinforcement and encouragement to keep me going! It was truly an A+++ experience!
